## Concurrent Enrollment Agreement and Forms 2022-2023 School Year

To complete the process of enrollment, which includes Concurrent Enrollment (CE) participation, additional paperwork and meetings are required. This is similar to how "choosing classes" for in-seat is done, but has a few additional requirements that need to be reviewed and understood.

The following forms are required to be completed or signed in order for a student to participate in the Concurrent Enrollment Program for only the 9-12th grade high school years, or for the super senior (13th year) ASCENT. These forms have been provided to you for review and make you aware of the finite details and requirements within the CE program.

Documents on the HOPE Academy website that are available for your review:
1.) CE Contract \& Information - This is a document that has been compiled to hopefully describe everything or "all things" CE. It should be able to answer any specific questions about the program, but may not be as specific to individual needs.
2.) Part-Time/Full-Time Comparison Sheet between Part-Time (Homeschooling) vs. Full-Time Participation as outlined in State Statutes (separate document)

The Forms listed below may require signatures and some do not. They are:
3.) Student Essay
4.) Instructions for ICAP Planning -Optional
5.) ICAP Form (Individual Career and Academic Plan) - Required
6.) Parent/Student CE Contract and Information, including Promissory Note and Checklists (separate document).
7.) Body of Evidence - ex. College Test Scores, Prev. Test Info, etc. (See Guide and Contract for Info.)
8.) Concurrent Enrollment College Agreement or ASCENT Agreement and Payment Agreement (executed once approved for program).
9.) There are four colleges that HOPE Academy is approved to participate, currently. Each college has a slightly different way of completing/finalizing with the college. Arapahoe Community College and Front Range Community College have online CE Agreements. Community College of Aurora and Red Rocks Community College still use the hard copy format.

3. Classes taken in a student's $8^{\text {th }}$ grade year may be reflected in their $9^{\text {th }}$ grade section (when transferring to full-time, these must be approved before credit will be awarded, as Jeffco School District Policies apply).
4. List all college classes taken and indicate such by writing (C) after the course name. Credit for college classes will vary by .5 and 1.0 credit.
5. Project your future high school courses by filling in the anticipated classes that will be taken.
